
Are you unable to attend services on Sunday because you are ill, unable to get-out or out of town? Now you don't have to miss a worship service!!

The Kuhudzayi Family Zimbabwe, Africa Made in Matobo

The Kuhudzayi Family, Brierly, Mackenzie, Charlotte & Selma, are started their own non-profit ministry, Made in Matobo. Their vision and mission of this ministry is to improve the quality of life in southern Africa through agriculture, and to build the Kingdom by walking alongside people and deepening faith. They also strive to see rural communities helping each other thrive in family and faith.

Zimbabwe has a national population of 15 million. There are two main tribes; Shona and Ndebele. 74% of the population claims to be Protestant, but only 3% of the Matobo district reports to attend a church. There are frequent electricity and water shortages. Zimbabwe is land locked so the cost of living is extremely high as everything has to be transported by truck or train. For

example, gasoline is \$6.13 per gallon and with the average estimated Gross Domestic Product at \$2,100/year, many people struggle to make ends meet.

While we are enjoying the warmth of summer, the Kuhudzayi's are in the midst of winter! While temperatures still reach 70-80 degrees during the day, the temperature at night gets down to 40 degrees. With the homes having very little insulation, they enjoy the fireplace and wear extra layers to bed.

The Kuhudzayi's were in Michigan over Easter. While they were here, they had an opportunity to attend a Mission Team meeting at Leighton Church, to update the committee on what is happening in their ministry.

On the agricultural side of their ministry, they started another batch of chickens, which is still underway, and have begun construction on a second chicken house. This will allow for increased cash flow for the projects, as well as more training opportunities on the ground.

They've resumed Bible studies and other fellowships where they have opportunities to both teach and be enriched themselves. Homeschooling and farmschooling are back in full swing.

Pray for Brierly & Mackenzie and their family and their ministry to the people in the Matobo district of Zimbabwe.

ALL ITEMS DONATED MUST BE NEW OR HANDMADE. USED ITEMS CANNOT BE GIVEN. Since last year's Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Drive was such a huge success (508 shoeboxes were filled and shipped last fall!), we are starting to collect items to fill shoeboxes again this year.

For the month of June, we are continuing to collect small toys, such as:

- Playing cards
- Dominoes
- Small jigsaw puzzles
- Matchbox cars
- Small stuffed animals

Pillowcase dresses are also needed for the girls. Examples can be found by the Operation Christmas Child display in the Lobby. The pattern is to the left. Adjust the length for the age of the child you are making it for (shorter for little girls, longer for older girls). If you need pillowcases, there are free pillowcases in the Lobby.



This will help with the shipping cost of the shoeboxes, which is \$10.00 per box. Place your filled container in the offering plate.
