

# **Next Steps & Membership Classes**

In the coming weeks, the first set of Next Steps and Membership Classes will be implemented since Leighton Church has become an independent church. Here is some information about these classes.

The Next Steps class is an introductory class that will help attenders of the church to learn more about Leighton Church and help to become more familiar with ways to connect with the Leighton Church family. Attenders will be exposed to some of the different ministries of the church, the sacraments, the bylaws, and so on. An important component of this class will be the Spiritual Gifts survey. Through the prayer and discussion surrounding it, my hope is to help connect people together in ministries in which God has prepared them as well as to help me better understand the gifting of our church.

The Membership Class will be for those that are interested in learning about becoming members of Leighton Church. This class will focus on what membership *is* and what it *is not*. The faith statement of the church will be reviewed and any questions regarding the bylaws will be addressed. Some of this information will overlap with the Next Steps Class. By the end of the course, the hope is that people will feel more confident about their decision to join the church.





"Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." ~Romans 12:21

Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a German pastor and theologian who spent his life in service to the Lord and in active resistance to Hitler and his Nazi regime.

He was executed in a German concentration camp, and his fervor still calls us to a deeper faith decades later. Bonhoeffer urged Christians to act on their faith: "Silence in the face of evil is itself evil; God will not hold us guiltless. Not to speak is to speak. Not to act is to act."

In a society wracked by moral depravity, we must speak and act out of our relationship with Jesus. In Isaiah 58: 6-7, God's heart is revealed. Here is what He longs for His children to do: to break the chains of injustice, to eliminate exploitation, to free the oppressed, and to cancel debts. He longs to see us share our food with the hungry, invite homeless into our homes, to clothe those with no garments, and to minister to our families.

When we do the things that He desires, He promises that our light will break out like the dawn, our healing and restoration will come quickly, our righteousness will escort us to the peace and prosperity of God, and His glory will bring up the rear guard. When we pray, He will answer with, "Here I am"! (Isaiah 58: 8-9).

We cannot delay. Begin to overcome evil with the goodness of God today!

Mel Trotter Ministries demonstrates the compassion of Jesus Christ toward anyone experiencing hunger and homelessness. The mission is inspired by the words of Matthew 25:35: "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in." This scripture guides them daily to bring an end to homelessness one life at a time.

In 2024, the mission welcomed 4,870 guests through their doors. Their newly renovated kitchen and cafeteria spaces allowed them to serve 185,768 nourishing meals to people experiencing food insecurity. They rejoice that 94 of their guests have dedicated their lives to Christ!

Mel Trotter Ministry extends far beyond shelter services. Last year, 118 families were able to avoid eviction, get connected with resources, and be diverted from ever experiencing homelessness in the first place. Their Prevention and Diversion Team, partners with the United Way, and breaks the cycle of homelessness and changes lives, particularly for young children by providing these stabilizing services.

Met Trotters Housing and Jobs program continues to grow and provide pathways out of homelessness. Despite the affordable housing shortage, they helped 391 individuals find stable housing in 2024. Recognizing the need for affordable housing, they constructed ten apartments at the Next Step of West Michigan campus. Through their comprehensive workforce development initiatives, it equips guests with the opportunity to learn both technical and soft skills, 361 individuals secured livable-wage jobs.

The positive impact Mel Trotter has had on the community was made possible by the 8,321 volunteer hours people donated, 3,559 outreach visits, and 898 medical clinic appointments. The shelter provided 168,430 nights of shelter and 2,935 showers in their Mobile Shower Unit. Behind all these statistics is a unique story that is now filled with hope and purpose. When individuals arrive on their doorstep overlooked, hit rock bottom, or having exhausted their relationships, they are met with care and compassion, and welcomed by a team to start their journey to a fresh start.

Thank you for supporting Mel Trotter Ministries. Your prayers and gifts have transformed lives and made an eternal impact on the Kingdom one life at a time. They are celebrating what the Lord has done through Mel Trotter Ministries for the past 125 years.

Dear Leighton Family,

Last year, as many of you might remember 1,061 shoeboxes were packed, and sent on their way with the help of Moline Baptist Church. The countries they were sent to include Eswatini, Guyana, Malawi, Jamaica, Trinidad, Tobago and Zambia.

Within the past few weeks, I received 2 emails from parents in Eswatini thanking us for the gifts in those shoeboxes. One parent asked us to pray for their son in school. When he finishes he would like to further his education and become a teacher. Both emails at the end asked that God will bless us for the generosity to their children.

We have also been collecting t-shirts. I am busy cutting them up to make them into jump ropes, koosh balls and small bags. For the rest of March and the month of April we will be collecting small items like card games, small cars, stuffed animals, and such. Right now Dollar Tree has a wide selection of these items that are of

good quality and will work very nice. Also, the small items could be toothbrushes or kids size silverware. Wal-Mart has packs of 5-6 toothbrushes for a dollar. If you go to the Perrigo Store in Allegan, you can get a good price on toothbrushes as well. Kids silverware can be purchased from IKEA for 6 sets for \$1.99 right now, and any purchase over \$50 is free shipping.



I am currently working on a list of other items that we will be collecting. Thanks to a couple of generous, anonymous donors we have a good start on pencils, erasers, and small items. Quarter containers will be placed in the Lobby soon. Take 1, take 2, fill with quarters and return. This money will go toward shipping. Please know, the shipping cost covers from the time the shoeboxes are delivered to the processing centers to the time it is placed in the child's hands. Even though it sounds like a lot, it really is just a little compared to what it means to the children.

There are many crafty things we could use help with! We would really appreciate help braiding the t-shirts to make the jump ropes among other things. Thank to the Ladies Circle of Joy group for working on jump ropes Monday during their meeting. Blessings,
